Communiqué from the March and June Meetings of the ACA, 2006

The Autism Council of Australia met in Albury on March 30 to April 1 2006.

- The meeting was attended by: Mick Clark (Autism Tasmania), Adrian Ford (Autism Spectrum Australia — Aspect), Jon Martin (Autism SA), Penny Beeston (AQ), Alison Bird (Autism NT), Verity Bottroff (ex officio), Judy Brewer Fischer (independent), Amanda Golding (Autism Vic), and Shane Garoni (Autism Association of ACT). Also Mark Clayton from Aspect was in attendance as Minutes Secretary. Val McKelvey was absent (Autism Association of WA).
- A key part of this meeting's agenda related to the ACA's constitution and the future of the ACA. Discussion over several hours was resolved by a unanimous decision to wind-up the ACA.
- The decision to wind up the ACA was predicated by another decision to form a
 new national advisory board on autism spectrum disorders from the
 current state and territory organisations that make up the ACA. It will be a
 much simpler organisation bound by a memorandum of understanding. The
 agreed purpose of the new national advisory board on autism spectrum
 disorders is to:
 - Be a source of information and systemic advocacy on autism spectrum disorders in Australia;
 - Develop a national policy framework for Australia on autism spectrum disorders;
 - Provide advice to the federal government on autism spectrum disorders
 - Support research into autism spectrum disorders;
 - Seek funding from federal government, corporations and the community to further its aims;
 - Support the corporate entity organising the biennial Australian Conference on Autism Spectrum Disorders;
 - Support the annual national autism awareness week and other agreed national promotions.
- A new MOU for the national advisory board is currently being developed in readiness for the next Board meeting and a wind-up letter to individual members has been sent.
- Judy Brewer Fischer announced her resignation from the Board of the ACA due to a desire to reduce her commitments. The ACA Board expressed their deepest gratitude and congratulations to Judy for her wonderful support of ACA and for developing a strong and positive collaboration between ACA and A4 during her tenure.

 The 2007 Biennial Australian Conference on Autism Spectrum Disorders is being convened by Autism Queensland and will be held at Royal Pines Resort, Gold Coast from 14 – 16 March 2007. The conference theme will be Creative Futures.

- The Prevalence Study data is currently under analysis with Dr. Katrina Williams.
- The next meeting of the ACA Board is scheduled for Friday 1 to Saturday 2 September in Melbourne.
