

# Australian Advisory Board on Autism Spectrum Disorders

## Communiqué from the Board meeting and AGM –November, 2007

- The **Directors** of the Australian Advisory Board on Autism Spectrum Disorders met by teleconference on November 23, 2007 for the AGM followed by a Board meeting.
- The Board elected **2008 Office Bearers** - Adrian Ford AUTISM SPECTRUM AUSTRALIA (Chairperson), Mick Clark AUTISM TASMANIA (Deputy Chairperson), Penny Beeston AUTISM QUEENSLAND (Secretary), Jon Martin AUTISM SA (Treasurer). The remaining Directors are Alison Bird AUTISM NT, Alison Byrne (AUTISM VICTORIA) & Bob Buckley AUTISM ASPERGER ACT. Secretariat support is provided by Julie Hook ASPECT.
- The Board welcomed Alison Byrne to the Board. Alison will be replacing Amanda Golding as AUTISM VICTORIA'S representative. Amanda has made a significant contribution in her time as Director of the Board and the former Autism Council of Australia and was warmly thanked.
- On 3 October 2007, the then Prime Minister, announced details of the Australian Government's autism package, **Helping children with autism**, delivering \$190.7 million in new funding over five years. A number of initiatives will be implemented nationally by the Departments of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (FaHCSIA), Health and Ageing (DoHA), and Education, Employment and Workplace Relations (DEEWR)

Adrian Ford, Jon Martin and Penny Beeston are representing the AAB on the ASD Advisory Group (ASDAG) set up to drive this initiative. This funding provides an unprecedented opportunity to improve the access to services for young children with ASD and their families, as well as access to training and support for teachers and families. - Fifteen applications were received for the **Apex Research grants**. This year the applications were more numerous and of a much higher calibre than in previous years. The final recommendation of the Professional Committee was to make the following grants. .

**\$8,000 – Dr Mark Nielson, Lecturer, School of Psychology, University of Queensland** for a research Project entitled "*Synchronic Imitation in Children with ASD: Imitation and the Social Deficit Hypothesis*".

**\$7,000 – Dr Jill Ashburner, Research & Development Officer, Autism Queensland** for a research Project entitled "*The introduction of keyboarding to students with autism spectrum disorder: a help or a hindrance?*"

- The Australian Advisory Board on Autism Spectrum Disorders is to establish a **Reference Group** comprising key professionals with specific expertise in autism spectrum disorders. Membership of this group will finalised by the end of January, 2008.
- Autism Spectrum Australia (Aspect) and the Advisory Board will co-host the **Asia Pacific Autism Conference 2009** (incorporating the **Biennial Australian Conference on ASD**). The conference will be held from **20<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> August, 2009** at the Darling Harbour Convention Centre, Sydney.
- **May 2008** has been deemed **Autism Spectrum Month**.
- The next Board meeting will be in Sydney on **11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> January 2008**.
